The program at a glance



Lessons and resources are delivered through secure digital platforms such as Microsoft Teams or Google Classroom. Students access weekly timetables, learning materials and updates in one convenient place.

Each child follows the relevant curriculum, with learning programs tailored to their individual strengths, interests and support needs. Teachers deliver live and recorded lessons using video modelling, interactive tasks and creative projects that cater to diverse learning styles.

Families stay closely connected with teachers through ongoing communication, regular feedback and

one-on-one check-ins. Each student is supported by an Onsite Supervisor – usually a parent or approved adult – who helps guide and encourage daily learning.

A dedicated Learning Support Team, which may include speech and occupational therapists and a social worker, provides additional help through weekly check-ins, optional social groups and Connection Days, ensuring every student feels supported, confident and engaged in their learning journey.
