



Aspect is seeking new school locations

Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect) schools provide education to approximately 1,200 students across 67 facilities. Each Aspect School consists of a main campus, with satellite classes based in host schools – typically Public Schools or Catholic Schools. Each school is custom-built and incorporates 21st century learning, but is designed with the needs of Autistic children in mind. All schools are registered and accredited with the relevant state education requirements.

Our schools work on a 'transitional model' that aims to provide Aspect students, from primary school through to high school, with the skills they need to move into a mainstream education or other specialist environment. As a registered independent school, we deliver the Australian curriculum while working to each student's autism-related learning needs, individual strengths, interests and aspirations.

While there are a lot of educational choices for parents with a child on the autism spectrum, Aspect remains the only autism-specific school operating in Australia. Unfortunately, there are currently long wait lists and a huge gap in services available to students on the autism spectrum. Without tailored educational support, children can fall behind at school and become excluded and isolated, resulting in feelings of stress, anxiety and lack of confidence.

An increasing demand from the growing population has resulted in a requirement to expand our offering to better meet the community's current demand for our educational services and to reach others in new and emerging communities. Autism is a condition that affects how a person thinks, feels, interacts with others, and experiences their environment. It is a lifelong disability that starts when a person is born and stays with them into old age. Every Autistic person is different to every other. This is why autism is described as a 'spectrum'.

An estimated 1 in every 70 people in Australia are on the autism spectrum. Along with their families, this means autism is a part of daily life for over 1 million Australians.

A not-for-profit organisation, Aspect has worked in partnership with people of all ages on the autism spectrum, and their families for over 50 years, delivering evidence-informed solutions that are person-centred and family-focused.

In addition to our schools, Aspect provides a range of services that assist people on the autism spectrum to realise their unique potential, whilst providing much-needed support to their families, carers and colleagues. Some of these services include diagnostic assessments, early intervention programs, adult services, support network therapies, employment services and mentoring.
